CLIENT CHOICE FOOD PANTRY PROGRAM

Our mission is to provide food to families in need. In 2019 we served 3,734 families, distributing 258,290 pounds of food providing 215,242meals. This benefited 8,787 individuals including 2,871 children. A significant portion of this food is from our community partners as well as Costco, Forgotten Harvest, Waterford Panera Bread, Meijer Simply Give, White Lake Community Garden, Waterford Insurance, Gleaners Food Bank, and Einstein Bagels.

TOTAL VALUE: \$444,259

EASTER MEALS PROGRAM

Through your donations we provided 217 families with food for a special Easter dinner including pie and candy! A total of 5,852 pounds of food was distributed to 161 children and 364 adults.

TOTAL VALUE: \$10,065

THANKSGIVING MEALS PROGRAM

We provided a record number of turkeys and all the fixings for a complete holiday meal for 249 families. This fed 594 people including 190 seniors and 194 children. Our low income families & elderly appreciate our holiday meals.

TOTAL VALUE: \$11,392

CHRISTMAS / HOLIDAY MEALS PROGRAM

For Christmas/Holiday meals again we fed a record number of 234 families. That's 558 people including 174 seniors and 183 hungry children given a complete holiday meal with ham, stuffing, potatoes, gravy, vegetables, rolls, cool whip & pie!

TOTAL VALUE: \$10,888

2019 CHILD SUMMER FOOD PROGRAM

We distributed additional food in June - August 2019. Summer is a difficult time for very low income families. Instead of children receiving free breakfast and lunch at school they are home and hungry. Many families do not have additional funds for meals and snacks throughout the day. Client families with children in the household received extra bags filled with child-friendly breakfast and lunch items at each of their monthly pantry visits. This program is supported by donations, churches, scout troops & Stamp Out Hunger food drive. 114 families with 229 children received 3,819 pounds of food or 3,183 meals to eat while school is out.

TOTAL VALUE: \$6,538

BACK TO SCHOOL PROGRAM

New back packs filled with grade appropriate school supplies, a shopping trip to Meijer for new clothing, and a Resale Store gift card were provided to 64 children, grades K-12, from 30 low income families. Throughout the month of October and September our families used vouchers in the Resale Store to purchase clothing for their children.

TOTAL VALUE: \$8,165

ADOPT A FAMILY CHRISTMAS/HOLIDAY-PROGRAM

Families, churches and businesses participated in our Adopt-A-Family Program, providing gifts to 108 families with 384 family members, including 161 children & 29 seniors! Thank you for helping put smiles on many children's faces this past Christmas!

TOTAL VALUE: \$48,350

CLOTHING & HOUSEHOLD VOUCHERS PROGRAM

Our Resale Store, open to the public, is supported by items donated from our generous community. Free clothing and household items valued at \$55,602 were given to 936 households. These items help clothe the family and provide household items to furnish a home. Client Services distributed to 399 people socks, books, PJ's, scarves, mittens, winter coats, hats etc. valued at \$12,217.

TOTAL VALUE: \$67,819

CRISIS FUNDING PROGRAM

Open Door provides life changing emergency funds to prevent evictions, utility shut-offs, fuel only gas cards, car repairs, medical needs, furniture, etc. 229 families were helped with \$32,803 in funds/support. In addition to funds provided directly by Open Door, we collaborate with many other church partners in securing over \$20,000 in additional funding to prevent crisis for families.




